Grave Creek Mound Archaeological Complex

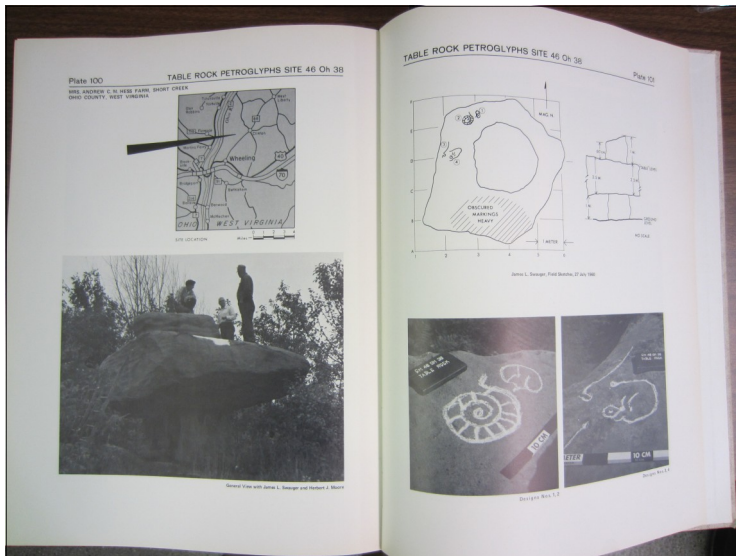
