LINNA HENNIG SHERMAN Jan. 20, 1873 – Feb. 18, 1958.

SUMMARY: Photographs and print material documenting the career of Linna Hennig Sherman, actress and teacher of drama. Also, pictures of other members of the Hennig family. Bulk of the collection is from the 1880s through the 1930s.

EXTENT: .5 lin. ft. -- 1 box; approximately 55-60 photographs, plus newspaper clippings and publicity materials.

PROVENANCE:

The collection was prepared by Eleanor Sherman Hennig, and came to the library in a box marked "Linna Hennig Sherman, her pictures, her achievements and honors, collected by her daughter, eleanor Sherman Hennig." The library received the material from L. Grubbs, 423 Woods Rd., Newport News, VA 23601, along with Eleanor's college scrapbook. Any accompanying information has be lost.

BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH:

Linna Hennig Sherman, 1873-1958, was an actress in Wheeling amateur theater, a founder of the Player's Club in the 1890s, and the Little Theatre in the 1920s. In 1904 or 05 she started the Sherman School, teaching dramatic arts, etc. She also taught in Steubenville and later at Mount de Chantal.

She was the daughter of Emil Isadore Hennig, 1831-1899. He was listed as homeopathic physician in census and city directories and lived at 24 11th St, Wheeling, where he also had his office. He was from Leipzig, Saxony. He was married to (Agnes) Adaline Large. Linna was the youngest of their nine children.

Her oldest brother Frank, after being a telegraph operator in the 1880 census listing, is recorded in the Wheeling city directories of 1884 and 1886 as a 'tragedian'. He may be the same Frank Hennig who name turns up as a Shakespearean actor, 1893-1903. One clipping notes that Frank was in Thomas Keene's company for many seasons.

At some point she married Samuel Sherman, born in September 1868. They had one daughter Eleanor Adaline Sherman (Oct. 15, 1901-April 12, 1994).

In 1900 they lived at 50 Zane Street. She is described as an elocutionist. He is listed as Trav. Passenger Agent WLE R.R. (Wheeling and Lake Erie Railroad) in the census and city directories.

They were somehow missed in the 1910 census.

Around 1904 they moved to 1413 Chapline Street, where Linna established the Sherman School. By 1910, Samuel is not in the city listings. In 1920, Linna is head of household at 1413 Chapline St., Wheeling, a teacher of dramatic arts. Eleanor is a student at the Music Con[servatory]

According to *Progressive West Virginians*, 1923 (she was one of a very few women included) she was president of the Sherman School of Expression and Dramatic Art, which she founded in 1905. She also taught at Mount de Chantal. She had earlier been organizer of the Player's Club of Wheeling.

A poignant note from her daughter on the back of one picture: "Fall of 1929. Before coming to Hilton Village, Va. This picture was taken just before my mother had a severe illness which became a prolonged nervous breakdown. She lost much weight which she never regained. Nor did she ever again have her usual vitality."

In the 1930 census Linna and Eleanor were living at 3200 West Ave., Newport News, Va. Linna was principal, dramatic school; Eleanor was supervisor of music, high school.

Eleanor organized the first Newport News High School marching band in 1929. She headed the high school music department until her retirement in 1959. She married Paul Kirkwood Hennig (1896-1976) who was her first cousin, the son of George Robert Hennig. Eleanor died in 1994.

Linna died Feb. 18, 1958 at Warwick, Va.

Later Pictures – portrait dated 1929; one "taken last July...with a visiting student from Whg, a girl I

taught 30 years ago..."; formal portrait 1920s or 30s; early picture with young man; later color picture of ??

Flora Williams – portrait by Kossuth. "A fine soprano and dear friend of Linna's, they were in the same Chautauqua Co."

Newpaper clippings – most fragmentary – 1956 article about Little Theater in Wheeling. Linna was among founders (News-Register, Sunday, Aug. 26, 1956) – "Mr Frank Hennig now entering upon his fourteen season with Mr. Thomas Keene...." -- "Mrs. Linna Hennig Sherman to Teach at Mt. De Chantal (Aug. 5, 1919) – Clipping about Sherman School of Expression, also naming Miss Alma Wilson, Miss Genevieve Ewing, Miss Carabel Zane – Linna Hennig Sherman Dramatic School Graduating Class of 1921 – 1926 Commencement Recital – Leah the Forsaken review, April 10, 1896 – Program, Court Theatre Attaches Benefit, May 19, 1903 – Evening of Comedy at Court Theatre, with Linna Hennig Sherman and Edward Franzheim at Mr. And Mrs. Honeyton (Sept. 4, 1904)
