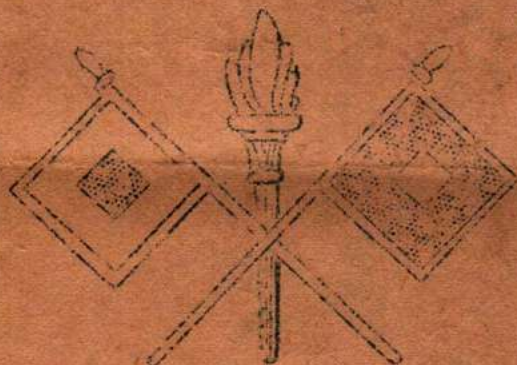


TELEPHONE DIRECTORY

TELEPHONE USER PRACTICES

1. Originating calls will be placed by number. This applies to intercommunicating calls and, whenever possible to local city and toll calls.
2. The calling party will hold the line after placing any call until the call is completed, "busy" or "don't answer" is received or until dismissed by the Army or commercial operator.
3. Operators will not be requested to locate persons. Telephone users will locate an individual who may be at one of several places by originating calls to the location involved.
4. Army operators will not be requested to try a number and call back when the person or number is available. On intercommunicating calls and local city trunk calls, where the called party or number is not reached, the telephone user will make his own subsequent attempts by originating his call again. On toll or long distance calls, the telephone user will be guided by instructions from the Army or commercial operator.
5. Operators will not be requested to intercept, temporarily, incoming calls and complete to a line that is other than the regular line for the individual involved. When a telephone user leaves the premises of his listed telephone, word should be left at the telephone as to where he can be reached, and when he will be back. Incoming calls for the individual can normally be handled on a call-back basis by whomever answers the telephone, while important calls may be transferred.
6. Operators will not be requested to perform secretarial services, such as announcing the calling party to the called telephone, taking and delivering messages, giving time of day service, passing the order on outgoing local city calls, etc.
7. A calling party desiring to place a toll or long distance call will reach the local Army operator and tell her that he wishes to make a long distance call giving the details of his call, as follows: extension number, party's name, city or town, only, and classification of call-official, personal, or collect.

The calling party will hold the line while the Army operator passes these details, plus a serial number to identify the call, to the commercial toll operator and will then supply additional information requested and hold the line in every case until dismissed by the Army or the commercial toll operator.

9. Whenever a telephone user accepts an incoming collect call, he will, at the conclusion of conversation, immediately notify the Army operator.

ALL TELEPHONES ARE CLASSIFIED FOR ADMINISTRATIVE PURPOSES AS FOLLOWS:

- CLASS A: Telephones for official business only--and access to trunk lines for that purpose. No personal calls will be made from A Class telephones.
- CLASS B: Telephones for personal use and access to trunk lines for that purpose.
- CLASS C: Telephones restricted to service within the camp. No access to trunk lines for either incoming and outgoing calls.
- CLASS D: Telephones restricted for guard and fire ONLY.
- PAY STATIONS: For personal calls.

NO PRIORITY CALLS WILL BE PLACED WITHOUT AUTHORITY OF THE COMMANDING OFFICER OR HIS REPRESENTATIVE.

TELEPHONE HABITS TO REMEMBER

1. Place calls by number.
2. Answer your telephone promptly.
3. Identify yourself when answering. Avoid the use of "hello" and "yes". Identify your office and give your name, example: "Camp Engineer, Mr. Brown."
4. Speak distinctly and courteously in a well modulated voice, with lips about half an inch from the mouthpiece.
5. Leave word when leaving your office. Be sure to leave information as to when you will return or where you can be reached by telephone for important calls.
6. Avoid making personal calls.
7. Make calls as brief as possible.
8. Be sure to replace receiver when you have finished talking.
