



Wheeling's 20th Man




On February 9, 1936, Harry H. Jones, Wheeling's only African American attorney at the time, delivered a talk on the city's whiteowned radio station WWVA. Titled "Wheeling's 20th Man," it referred Black's representing one twentieth, or 5%, of the city's population at the time. The speech centered on the conditions faced by

Wheeling's African American citizens under "Jim Crow," a system designed to segregate Black and White citizens into separate communities. In a courageous challenge to the Wheeling community, Jones asked people to consider the inequality of Jim Crow, in terms of access to jobs, housing, recreation, and

education. He appealed for empathy for the African American community and asked listeners to consider the legal and social changes needthe legal and social changes needed to address these inequities.
