Summary Paragraph

The Warwood Historic District is located in Ohio County approximately 2 miles north of downtown Wheeling. Warwood is a working- and middle-class neighborhood situated on the eastern banks of the Ohio River. The Appalachian Mountains and WV Route 2 (WV-2) also known as Warwood Avenue stretch in a north-south direction along Warwood's eastern edge. The terrain consists of flat river-basin land. Warwood is densely populated with a mixture of residential, commercial, industrial, religious, and educational facilities. The buildings were constructed close together on narrow lots and designed in popular late nineteenth and early twentieth century architectural styles including Colonial Revival, Victorian, Bungalow/Craftsman, and American Foursquare, amongst others. Garden Park is centrally located between central and southern Warwood. The Warwood Historic District boundaries are the Ohio River to the west, N 23rd Street to the north, Warwood Avenue and River Road to the East, and the Centre Foundry & Machine site to the south. The Warwood Historic District includes one individually listed resource: Warwood Fire Station (listed 1996) located at 1609 Warwood Avenue. This district includes 911 properties, including one property previously listed in the National Register, 1214 contributing resources (881 contributing primary buildings and 333 contributing outbuildings), and 30 non-contributing resources.

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Narrative Description

Setting

Ohio County is located in the Northern Panhandle of West Virginia and borders Pennsylvania to the east, the Ohio River to the west, Brooke County to the north, and Marshall County to the south. Warwood is part of the Wheeling metropolitan area and is situated in the west central portion of Ohio County. The Ohio River flows along Warwood's western boundary and Glens Run, a tributary of the Ohio River, flows in an east/west direction across Warwood between N 23rd and N 24th Streets. Warwood Avenue (WV Route 2) is the main north-south thoroughfare in Warwood and is situated along its eastern edge. Other north-south streets include Richland Avenue which runs through the center of Warwood between N 23rd Street to N 3rd Street, River Road on the western edge and smaller streets Hazlett Avenue, Hess Avenue, Vance Avenue, and Lock Avenue. Numbered streets, N 3rd Street to N 23rd Streets and alleys cross in an east-west direction. Residences were platted close together on narrow, rectangular lots. Front yards are well-manicured with plants and trees. Pedestrian sidewalks stretch parallel to the numbered and named streets and lead from the street to the residences. Some of the dwellings have detached one and two-car garages located at the rear of their properties and accessed from the alleys.

Warwood's setting and layout is that of an early 20th century mixed-used neighborhood where people lived, worked, shopped, attended church and school, and socialized within a walkable area. The neighborhood consists of streets lined predominantly with single family homes punctuated by large manufacturing facilities and city infrastructure such as the water treatment plant. Houses are typically two-story early 20th century styles, with some smaller one-story homes and apartments and larger high-style houses built to accommodate residents on either end of the economic spectrum. Commercial, educational, and religious buildings are located primarily along the main thoroughfare of Warwood Avenue, but some are scattered within the residential streets.

On Warwood's western edge, the Pittsburgh, Cincinnati, Chicago, and St. Louis Railroad (P. C. C. & St L), a branch of the Pennsylvania Railroad, traveled in a north-south direction along the banks of the Ohio River. Built between the railroad line and Ohio River were factories including the Warwood Tool Company, US Corrugated Fiber Box Company and the Continental Can Company. The P. C. C. & St L Railroad passenger station was situated on a lot between N 17th and N 16th Streets. The passenger station is no longer extant. The railroad tracks have been removed and replaced with the Wheeling Heritage Trail, a paved walking and bicycle trail that runs parallel to the Ohio River.

Warwood's terrain is a largely flat river basin with the Appalachian Mountains on its eastern edge. The flat land was originally utilized for farmland and truck gardens (small-scale commercial gardens in which fruits and vegetables were raised for market) with farm houses constructed near Warwood Avenue. The current built environment of Warwood reflects its residential, commercial, and industrial development. The streets in Warwood follow a grid pattern with the numbered streets (N 3rd Street to N 23rd Street) and named alleys (Lane) running in an east-west direction and named streets running in a north-south direction. Warwood's grid pattern consists of three distinct areas: northern Warwood, located north of Glens Run; central Warwood, located between Glens Run and Lock Avenue; and southern Warwood, south of Lock Avenue. Four large lots containing Garden Park, Warwood Shopping Center, Warwood Grade and Middle Schools, and Wheeling Water Department-Filtration create a physical and visual distinction between the central and southern sections of Warwood, while a wooded area alongside Glens Run separates northern and central Warwood. A large spoil pit where Centre Foundry dumped sand used in the casting process is located just north of Glens Run.

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Residential Buildings

Most of Warwood's extant residential buildings date from the early twentieth century, with the majority constructed between 1900 and 1941. The residences are detached single-family dwellings and were built close together on narrow and rectangular lots. Residences retain the scale and continuity of Warwood as it appeared in the early-to-mid twentieth century. While residences on the numbered and named streets sit towards the front of the level lots, residences along the eastern edge of Warwood Avenue sit back from the street on the hillside. A few of the residences on Warwood Avenue have brick or stone retaining walls near the pedestrian sidewalk. The district also contains multi-family housing such as apartment buildings, Garden Park Terrace, a nine-story high rise constructed in 1971 at 1208 Warwood Avenue (noncontributing resource) and one on the corner of N 22nd Street and Richland Avenue, and a retirement home for senior citizens, Warwood Estates. Wheeling architect Frederic Faris designed the Warwood Estates previously known as the Home for Aged Men. Construction of the Home of Aged Men began in 1929 at 1700 Warwood Avenue.

The oldest buildings in Warwood were constructed in the 1890s and early 1900s. One example from the nineteenth century is the residence at 322 Richland Avenue (Map No. 584). In the first decade of the twentieth century, twenty-five residences were constructed, and the majority of the remaining buildings were constructed in the 1910s and 1920s. Less than 1% of the total buildings or 10 out of 910 properties (not including outbuildings) were constructed outside the Period of Significance.

The residences share a similar appearance, massing and architectural details. Sanborn Fire Insurance Maps from 1921, 1951 and 1952 show dense residential blocks with one-and-a-half and two-story single-family dwellings. The majority of the residences are rectangular in shape and of wood frame construction with a smaller number brick or stone. The residences vary in their exterior materials including brick, vinyl siding, shingles, and aluminum siding. Many of the residences also feature one-story, full-width or partial front porches and front or side gable roofs with gable and hipped dormers. Bay windows on the second story of the front façade and side elevations are common. A smaller number of the single-family residences have more high-style architectural details including exposed rafters, Corinthian and Ionic columns, modillions, brick quoins, cornices, belt courses, and turrets.

The residences in Warwood represent a variety of popular late nineteenth century and early 20th century architectural styles including Colonial Revival, Dutch Colonial Revival, Tudor Revival, Bungalow, American foursquare, and Victorian. In 1904, the Warwood Tool Company constructed four residences for their employees. Two of these residences, located at 145 N 19th Street (Map No. 365) and 142 N 18th Street (Map No. 304), were designed in the American Foursquare and Dutch Colonial Revival styles of architecture. Ten years later in 1914, two Lockmasters houses at 275 (Map No. 576) and 276 Richland Avenue (Map No. 575) were constructed in the Tudor Revival style of architecture. The Colonial Revival style of architecture is most prevalent in the district, followed by American Foursquare and Bungalow. Table 1 below summarizes the architectural styles found within the district.

Warwood Avenue includes a small number of single-family dwellings that were constructed in higher styles of architecture by prominent men in Warwood. One of these residences was the George Dorsch House (Map No. 841) located at 1100 Warwood Avenue. Constructed in 1918, it was designed in the Neoclassical style of architecture. Another residence, the Dowler-Schreyer House was constructed in 1906 at 1900 Warwood Avenue (Map No 882) in the Queen Anne style of architecture. This residence features a three-story circular tower with turrets.

Non-Residential Buildings

Manufacturing was a primary factor in Warwood's growth. The first company to relocate to Warwood was the Warwood Tool Company (Map No. 380). Its relocation from Wheeling to Warwood at N. 19th Street coincided with Warwood's residential development. Factories including the US Corrugated Fiber Box Company and Continental Can Company (Map No. 62, also the location for the Wheeling Stamping Company) developed along the western edge of Warwood. Other businesses including a lumber warehouse, bakery, and utilities such as the electric substation and transformers and Wheeling Water Works (Map No. 660) were also located on Warwood's western edge near the Pittsburgh, Cincinnati, Chicago, and St. Louis Railroad line. The Centre Foundry & Machine Shop (Map No. 707) is situated between the railroad lines and Warwood Avenue in the southern portion of Warwood.

As the population of Warwood increased, a variety of businesses were established with the majority located along Warwood Avenue. The Bank of Warwood (no longer extant), Fire Station No. 11 (Map No.

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864), grocery stores, medical and law offices, automobile-related services, and restaurants developed along Warwood Avenue. Mixed-use commercial and residential buildings were constructed along Warwood Avenue and N. 17th Street.

There are four churches within the boundaries of the Warwood Historic District: the Warwood Evangelical Lutheran Church (Map No. 863), Corpus Christi Catholic Church (Map No. 857), Warwood United Methodist Church (Map No. 848), and Warwood Christian Church (Map No. 662). In 1911, the Warwood Christian Church was constructed at 1650 Richland Avenue. It was built by John L Geisey, brother of local architect Millard Fillmore Geisey.¹ The other three churches were constructed along Warwood Avenue. Designed in the Gothic Revival style of architecture, the Warwood Evangelical Lutheran Church was constructed in 1917 on land purchased from the Warwood Land Company. The Corpus Christi Catholic Church at 1516 Warwood Avenue was designed by Edward Weber of Pittsburgh in the Colonial Revival style of architecture. The fourth church is the Warwood United Methodist Church, a Gothic Revival building located at 1438 Warwood Avenue; the educational building was added in 1959. All four churches are contributing resources to the Warwood Historic District.

The Warwood Historic District also features four schools including the Corpus Christi Grade School, Central (Old Warwood) High School, Warwood Elementary, and Warwood Middle. Two of the four educational facilities are located along Warwood Avenue while Warwood Elementary and Middle School are located on Richland Avenue. Warwood High School (Map No. 865) was constructed in the Gothic Revival style of architecture at 1610 Warwood Avenue in 1918. High school students attended Warwood High School until 1977 when it became Warwood Junior High School. Corpus Christi Grade School is the other school located on Warwood Avenue; it was designed in the Modern style of architecture. On the western edge of Warwood on Richland Avenue is Warwood Elementary and Middle School (Map No. 657), were designed in the Art Moderne style of architecture.

Integrity

The Warwood Historic District retains integrity of location, setting, workmanship, design, materials, feeling, and association. The majority of the buildings in Warwood remain in their original locations on narrow lots. A small number of residences and commercial buildings have been demolished. While the majority of the buildings have been altered with new siding and roofs and replacement windows, the overall character of this working and middleclass neighborhood remains. Warwood's history as a predominantly residential neighborhood that provided the necessities of life within walking distance – jobs, shops, education, religion, recreation – remains evident in its large number of extant buildings and residential scale. The historic district conveys its original design and significance under Criterion A for its association with community planning and development.

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Statement of Significance Summary Paragraph (Provide a summary paragraph that includes level of significance, applicable criteria, justification for the period of significance, and any applicable criteria considerations.)

The Warwood Historic District is significant at the local level under Criterion A in the areas of Commerce and Industry and Criterion C in the area of Architecture. Warwood, a working-and middle-class neighborhood in the northern part of Wheeling, was incorporated in 1911 and annexed by the City of Wheeling nine years later in 1920. Throughout the nineteenth century, the area was predominantly agricultural with estates and truck gardens or gardens where fruits and vegetables were raised for markets located between the Ohio River to the west and the Appalachian Mountains to the east. As businesses and industries were established in Warwood during the early twentieth century, the population increased, and the town developed. The Period of Significance is from 1890 to 1967, beginning with the date of construction of the earliest extant resource and ending with the construction date of the townhouses on North 18th and North 19th Streets. These townhouses represent the continuing evolution of housing for workers in the neighborhood. Buildings constructed after 1967 in the district are architecturally undistinguished, lack integrity and/or are less than 50 years old. The historic district retains its integrity as a mixed industrial, residential, and commercial district.

Narrative Statement of Significance (Provide at least **one** paragraph for each area of significance.)

Criterion A: Industry

The Warwood Historic District is locally significant under Criterion A in the area of Industry. Industrial enterprises are directly responsible for the development of the modern Warwood community. Following the relocation of the Warwood Tool Company to the area in 1905, a series of manufacturing businesses were established, including Warwood Armature Company, Continental Can Company, Wheeling Stamping Company, and Centre Foundry & Machine Company. Throughout the period of significance, Warwood's economy relied heavily on these industrial businesses. Many of the industrial resources in the district are extant, while a handful of manufacturing businesses such as the Warwood Tool Company remain in operation. The continued presence of industrial resources helps the district retain integrity by conveying its associations with local industrial history.

Criterion A: Commerce

The Warwood Historic District is also locally significant under Criterion A in the area of Commerce. Commercial activity played a key role in Warwood's twentieth century history. As discussed, the community's economy revolved around the manufacturing businesses present in the area. Businesses such as Warwood Tool Company, Warwood Armature Company, Continental Can Company, Wheeling Stamping Company, and Centre Foundry & Machine Company produced a variety of marketable goods. Close proximity to the railroad and the Ohio River granted easy access to transportation to ship products long distances. The numerous

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manufacturing businesses sparked development of residential areas, associated businesses, and social infrastructure such as schools and churches to service the factory employees and families. Businesses, including banks, restaurants, and shops, emerged to provide the community with essential goods and services. Commercial development in Warwood made the community a livable and attractive area by accommodating resident's needs, all in a walkable residential community.

Criterion C: Architecture

The Warwood Historic District is locally significant under Criterion C in the area of Architecture as an important, intact example of an early-to-mid twentieth century primarily working- and middle-class residential neighborhood. The district contains a dense concentration of residences in a variety of popular architectural styles including Queen Anne, Colonial Revival, Craftsman, Tudor Revival, Neoclassical, Lustron, and others. The closely packed houses in popular styles tell the story of this neighborhood's rapid development as industry and commerce grew, a corresponding need for housing, and workers' growing prosperity and achievement of home ownership. The density of the neighborhood combined with the variety of architectural styles gives Warwood a unique architectural scale and aesthetic. The district also has several other substantial resources, such as schools and churches, that have significant architectural designs. The district has very few demolitions and intrusions and retains integrity.

Historic Context

Early exploration and settlement

The Ohio Valley around Wheeling was occupied by indigenous American peoples for at least 16,000 years. It is the ancestral homeland of indigenous peoples including the Shawnee, Wyandot, Delaware (Lenape), and Cayuga.³ The name "Wheeling" is derived from the Lenape language and is translated as "place of the head" in reference to a purported skull placed on a pole at the mouth of Wheeling Creek.⁴

Early European explorers including Captain Abraham Wood, land speculator William Byrd, and German physician John Lederer led expeditions westward towards present-day West Virginia. In 1710, explorers crossed the Blue Ridge Mountains into the Ohio River Valley.⁵ In the following years, trading posts and forts were established along the Ohio River to trade furs with indigenous peoples and the French, who also claimed land in the Ohio River Valley. In October 1770, George Washington became the first recorded explorer in present-day Warwood.⁶ This expedition took Washington from his home at Mount Vernon westward to the Ohio River. In his

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journal, Washington wrote about the fertile land in the area as well as two islands at the mouth of Glenn's Run where he and his companions camped.⁷

As European settlers moved westward, territorial conflicts with indigenous people increased and continued through the end of the 18th century. After the Battle of Fallen Timbers in 1794, indigenous people were forced to leave the Northwest Territory (now Ohio) for points west.⁸

Eighteenth and Nineteenth Centuries

In 1769, the first non-indigenous settlers Ebenezer Zane (1747-1812), his two brothers Silas and Jonathan Zane, their associates, and enslaved people migrated to present-day Wheeling. Ebenezer Zane, the "Founder of Wheeling" established the first permanent settlement at the confluence of Wheeling Creek and the Ohio River.⁹ The Virginia General Assembly established the town of Wheeling in 1795 and it was incorporated as a city ten years later in 1805. Wheeling developed as a significant commercial and manufacturing center on the Ohio River and the county seat of Ohio County. The descendants of the first families later relocated to Warwood.

In the 1770s, surveyor and settler Thomas Glenn acquired land in present-day Warwood. He settled in the northern part of present-day Warwood.¹⁰ Others soon followed including David Garden, George Dorsch, and Phillip Reilly. In 1816, David Garden emigrated from Scotland and later settled on a farm at Glenn's Run, Virginia. His farm extended from N. 23rd Street south and between the Ohio River and the hill side.¹¹ David Garden also established a tannery in North Wheeling where his son Alexander T. Garden also worked. An 1891 map of the Northern Panhandle (Map 1) shows Alexander T. Garden owned a large tract of land near Glenn's Run.

Warwood was sparsely populated and predominantly rich farmland during the eighteenth and nineteenth centuries. Throughout the 1800s, estates and truck gardens or gardens where vegetables were raised for the markets—were located along the flat and fertile land near the Ohio River. The estates were owned by the Dorsch, Gardens, Lash (Lasch), Stenger and Riley (Reilly) families.¹² These early farmers transported their crops to the markets in Wheeling by horse and buggy, and later train.

One of the major methods of transportation for early farmers was the Pittsburgh, Cincinnati, Chicago, and St. Louis Railroad. Construction of the Pittsburgh, Cincinnati, Chicago, and St. Louis Railroad also known as the "Panhandle Route" began in 1872. This 50-mile branch of the Pennsylvania Railroad stretched along the eastern banks of the Ohio River between Chester in Hancock County and Wheeling. It connected with the Baltimore & Ohio Railroad line at

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Wheeling Junction. Goods produced in Ohio County were transported by rail to markets in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, Chicago, Illinois, and St. Louis, Missouri.

Early Development of Warwood

Historic maps show the development of Warwood from predominantly farmland to a neighborhood with a mixture of residences, factories, and businesses. The earliest available map, drawn in 1871, depicts the counties in West Virginia's Northern Panhandle (Map 1). In this map, major landowners in the Richland Magisterial District include A. T. Garden, P. Riley, J. Lash, Mrs. Woods, and J. J. Carney. USGS topographic maps from the early 1900s also show a largely agrarian landscape in present day Warwood with signs of development beginning to appear, including the Pittsburgh, Cincinnati, Chicago, and St. Louis Railroad along the bank of the Ohio River and a few buildings along Warwood Avenue in the central section and one building in the southern section. The next available map, the Ohio County, West Virginia (Farmline Map), drawn in 1918, shows three grid pattern areas: one in the northern section, one in the central section, and one in the southern section as well as undeveloped areas to the immediate north and south of the central section. The David Garden Estate, George and his brother Casper Dorsch, W. Stenger, and J. C. Moore owned the undeveloped land.¹³

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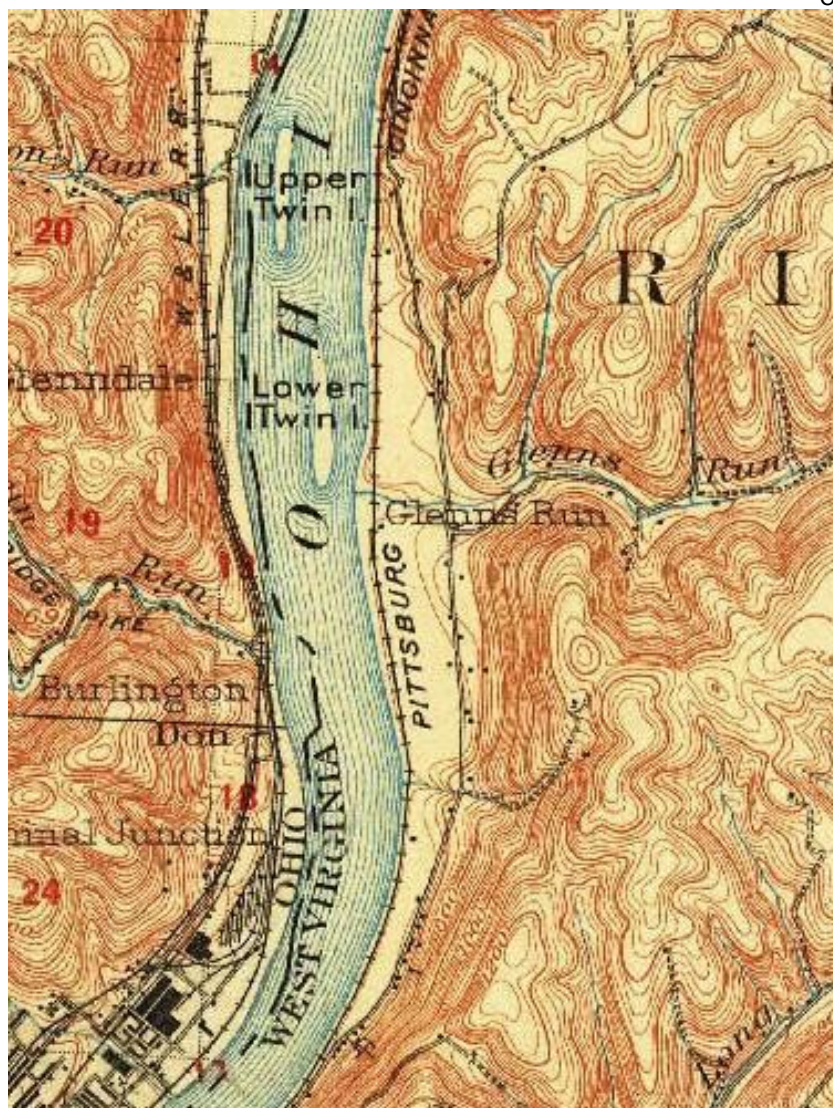

Warwood's economy remained agriculturally based until 1905 when the Warwood Tool Company relocated to Warwood. In 1854, Henry Warwood (1832-1900), an immigrant from Staffordshire, England, founded the Warwood Tool Company in Martins Ferry, Ohio. His company built garden tools and tools for the coal, railroad, and steamboat industries. In 1892, Warwood sold his company to Daniel L. Heiskel and moved to Brooklyn, New York.¹⁴ Eleven years later in 1903, the Warwood Tool Company purchased seven acres of land belonging to Alexander Garden and constructed a factory at the foot of N. 19th Street, which was completed in 1905.¹⁵ The Warwood Tool Company (Map No. 380) is extant and continues to operate at 164 N. 19th Street in Warwood. The Warwood Tool Company also constructed four company houses for employees: John A. Moore, secretary and later President, resided at 142 N. 18th Street (Map No. 304); Fred Reese, manager of the Warwood Tool Forge Shop, resided at 145 N. 19th Street (Map

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No. 365); and J. W. Bumgardner, superintendent, resided at 419th Street (no longer extant) while the final house (location unclear) was utilized as an office.¹⁶

The area surrounding the Warwood Tool Company was ripe for development due to the expanding industrial economy. Foreseeing the potential development of this area, Robert J. McCullagh and some business associates formed the Warwood Land Company in 1903. This company purchased over 127 acres of land from the Garden Estate and divided it into five sections.¹⁷ Although the Warwood Land Company does not appear to have had a formal business connection to the Warwood Tool Company, the two companies must have coordinated planning efforts on some level considering the timing of these land purchases.¹⁸ McCullagh was appointed General Manager and Treasurer and worked with realtor Samuel L. Nesbitt to sell available lots in Central Warwood between N. 16th Street and Glens Run.¹⁹ The following year in July 1904, McCullough submitted a real estate plat of Warwood.²⁰ Other land companies also were established in the area included the Wheeling Improvement Company in Glenova (North Warwood) in 1902 and the Loveland Land Company (South Warwood) in 1905. These companies sold lots for a minimum of \$300 and marketed the fertile land, streetcar line, and quality of water. While the majority of these lots did not come with residences, a small number did.²¹ Smaller real estate companies like the Sun Realty Company purchased land in 1923 and platted lots between N 22nd and N 23rd Streets in the Sun Addition.²² The land companies assigned each lot a number beginning at one. By 1907, the population of Warwood totaled 3,000 inhabitants and reached 7,000 in 1935.²³

The land companies promoted a streetcar line in their marketing materials of Warwood. In 1901, the Panhandle Traction Company, previously known as the Northern Ohio Valley Railway Company, constructed the first interurban streetcar line. This electric railway line traveled in a north-south direction between Wheeling and Wellsburg, (Brooke County) West Virginia. In Warwood, the single gauge line was constructed along Warwood Avenue and operated on fifteen-minute schedules.²⁴ An amusement park with a roller coaster, Ferris wheel, skating rink, and other rides was constructed nearby on the first Sister Island, aka Lower Twin Island. Beginning in 1905, thousands of patrons crossed a boardwalk located at N. 24th Street and Hazlett Avenue to spend the day at the amusement park.²⁵

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The Warwood Tool Company was soon followed by other companies including the Continental Can Company in 1912, T. G. Cupp and Sons in 1916, Centre Foundry & Machine Shop in 1923, and the Warwood Armature Company in 1927. Warwood was an attractive location for construction of industrial facilities due to its proximity to downtown Wheeling, large areas of undeveloped land on which to build both factories and housing for workers, and easy access to rail and river transportation. These companies manufactured tools, cans, roofing and metal, heating stoves, steam boiler grates, and other iron products, and rewinding armatures for the coal industry and electric motors. These industries contributed to the growth and development of Warwood. Two of these companies, the Continental Can Company (Map No. 62) and the Centre Foundry & Machine Shop (Map No. 707) no longer operate in Warwood, although their facilities are extant. The Continental Can Company was purchased by Wheeling Steel and relocated to Oil City, Pennsylvania in the 1950s while the Centre Foundry & Machine Shop, 74 Warwood Avenue, closed its doors in 2023. Warwood Armature Company (Map No. 578) continues to operate and relocated from 128 N. 7th Street to the corner of Hazlett Avenue and N. 9th Street while T. G. Cupp and Sons relocated from 98 N 22nd Street to 55 N 28th Street.

Another company that relocated to Warwood was the Wheeling Stamping Company (Map No. 62). In 1877, the Wheeling Stamping Company was founded as the Nail City Lantern Company in Wheeling. It manufactured lanterns, lamp burners, fruit tops, toothpaste tubes, lithograph tin ware and metal specialties.²⁶ When the Wheeling Stamping Company opened a factory in Warwood circa 1956-1957 the company was mainly producing collapsible toothpaste tubes. Their manufacturing plant was located in the former Packer Trucking Company and Continental Can Company building on the corner of Hazlett Avenue and N. 9th Street which was originally constructed in 1912. Today, the factory building houses Warwood Armature, Continental Ventures, and Primedia Products.²⁷

Before the town of Warwood was incorporated in 1911, it was comprised of three separate and independent communities: Glenova, Richland, and Loveland. Named in honor of the area's first resident Thomas Glenn, Glenova stretched from Glenn's Run to the northern end of North Warwood. Richland is referred to as Warwood or Center Warwood while South Warwood was originally known as Loveland. Each of these communities was responsible for providing education, public works, public safety, and other amenities.²⁸ The first attempts to incorporate the Loveland and South Warwood communities as "Woodsboro" proved unsuccessful as large companies including the Pennsylvania Railroad and Richland Coal Company opposed incorporation.²⁹ Another attempt to incorporate all three communities soon followed. The opposition contested the election results in the Circuit Court and the court ruled in the opposition's favor on a technicality, a census needed to be conducted. After the updated census, residents of Glenova, Richland, and Loveland voted to incorporate as the town of Warwood in May 1911.³⁰

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The same year, construction of Lock and Dam No. 12 began in southern Warwood. The Ohio River had served as an important method of transportation in the Wheeling area throughout its history. However, seasonal changes in water levels made navigation difficult. A series of locks and dams were constructed along the Ohio River beginning in 1875 between Pittsburgh, PA and the Mississippi River. Under the supervision of the Army Corps of Engineers, the Foundation Company of New York began building the Ohio River Lock and Dam No. 12 in 1911 and it was completed in 1916.³¹ Construction of the locks and dams at a navigable depth of nine-feet made the Ohio River navigable year round. In 1914, the federal government constructed two Tudor Revival residences in south Warwood at 276 Richland Avenue (OH-0001-1950 Resurvey) and 275 Richland Avenue (OH-1032-0005) to house the six appointed lockmasters. Lock and Dam No. 12 operated until its replacement, the Pike Island Lock and Dam, was completed in 1963.

In 1919, the “Greater Wheeling Movement,” a campaign to annex eight neighboring communities into the City of Wheeling, began. The eight communities included Warwood, Elm Grove, Edgewood, Fulton, Leatherwood, Patterson, and Pleasant Valley. The West Virginia legislature prepared annexation paperwork the same year but left the final decision to residents. They also decided the final vote from Wheeling and the eight communities should be counted together and not individually. Warwood residents voted against annexation 237 to 154.³² Six of the other communities also voted against annexation; however, Wheeling residents overwhelmingly supported annexation and the eight neighboring communities became part of Wheeling in 1920.

Following annexation, the City of Wheeling began funding infrastructure improvement projects in Warwood. The first project in Warwood involved paving the streets. This was soon followed by spending \$30,000 for fire alarms, \$25,700 for two 750 gallon pumpers and \$15,000 a fire station.³³ In 1922, the Wheeling City Council approved plans for constructing the Warwood Fire House (NR #96000440) at 1609 Warwood Avenue. Designed by Wheeling architect Millard Fillmore (M. F.) Giesey, construction began on the Warwood Fire House No. 11 in 1923.³⁴ The same year, a water filtration plant was built in Warwood at 1551 Richland Avenue. This Art-Deco water plant was designed by Pittsburgh’s J. N. Chester Engineers.

Growth of Warwood continued in the 1920s as businesses relocated and working-class families sought employment at the nearby industries. In 1923, the Centre Foundry & Machine Company relocated to the south end of Warwood from South Wheeling. The Centre Foundry, founded in 1840, manufactured iron castings, heating stoves and steam boiler grates for the steamboat industry.³⁵ Four years later in 1927, Raymond V. Thalman and Lawrence J. Schmitt founded the Warwood Armature Repair Company in a garage at 431 Hazlett Avenue. The company produced

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rewinding armatures for the coal industry. As the company grew more space was needed and they purchased a piece of land at the corner of N 7th Street and Hazlett Avenue.³⁶

A commercial area with businesses developed along Warwood Avenue in the early twentieth century. Opened in 1911, the Bank of Warwood was originally located at 1713 Warwood Avenue before relocating three years later to 1701 Warwood Avenue. The two-story, brick building was designed by architect M. F. Giesey and housed a bank on the first floor and two businesses and a library on the second. The bank was demolished in 2015. Warwood Avenue also featured two family-operated grocery stores, McNamara Drug Store, restaurants, and automobile-related services.

As farmland in Warwood continued to be filled with residential, educational, religious, commercial, and industrial buildings, few lots remained undeveloped. During the 1920s, the City of Wheeling noticed the lack of neighborhood parks and believed residents needed parks for recreation purposes and relaxation.³⁷ In 1927, the City of Wheeling purchased nine-acres of land belonging to the Garden Estate for the purpose of creating a park. Garden Park, named for the Garden family, is bordered by Warwood Avenue, Richland Avenue, Osage Lane, and Viking Drive. The 1951 Sanborn Fire Insurance Map shows a green space, athletic field, two field houses, and a playground.³⁸ A swimming pool and basketball court were added by 1960.

Construction of homes in Warwood was heavily concentrated in the first decades of the twentieth century. Based on estimated dates of construction in the 2017 Warwood Historic Resource Survey, around 58% of homes in Warwood were constructed by 1920, 75% were constructed by 1930, and 83% were constructed by 1940. The architectural styles of homes in the district reflect this period of increasing home ownership and choices among homeowners to build in a variety of popular styles, including Colonial Revival, American Foursquare, Queen Anne, Victorian, Tudor Revival, Craftsman Bungalow, and others. Lot owners appear to have had no prescriptions from land companies on style or house layout, although most houses are two or two-and-a-half stories. The economic growth and prosperity of the early twentieth century allowed working- and middle-class people to achieve the American dream of home ownership, and to express their individual tastes through the design of their homes. A full spectrum of twentieth century architecture is on view in Warwood, from small, modest bungalows to large, high-style mansions. In addition to the dense development of Warwood's residential streets, commercial, civic, religious and educational buildings were constructed to accommodate the growing population.

World War II to Late 20th century

Following World War II, additional single-family residences continued to be constructed on vacant lots throughout Warwood. These residences were designed in Modern styles of architecture including Ranch, Split-Level, Minimal Traditional, and Lustron as well as popular

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early twentieth century styles. The 1951 Sanborn Map also shows a new addition, the McCullagh & Dickey Addition, in the southern portion of Warwood. This addition is located along Warwood Avenue near the Centre Foundry & Machine Company. The McCullagh & Dickey Addition has a mixture of large lots with the Centre Foundry & Machine Company office, businesses, single family dwellings, and vacant rectangular and narrow lots.³⁹ At the southern end is the Costanco Coal Mining Company Richland Mine. The tipples, conveyer, and railroad tracks are no longer extant.

In 1963, Bernard Lipscher and Bill Hundley purchased land along Warwood Avenue for the Warwood Shopping Plaza. An aerial map from 1958 shows a commercial building on the lot, possibly constructed in 1958 by the previous owner, a New York firm.⁴⁰ This shopping center included a grocery store, pharmacy, dry cleaners and a movie theater. Shopping centers with large parking lots began replacing small, family-operated businesses.

The overall population in Wheeling began declining in the mid-to-late 20th century, following statewide and regional trends in the decline of industries such as coal and steel. One result of the declining population was the consolidation of area high schools. The Ohio County Board of Education consolidated Warwood, Wheeling, and Triadelphia High Schools to form Wheeling Park High School.⁴¹ In 1976, Warwood High School (Map No. 865) located at 1610 Warwood Avenue closed its doors and students began attending Wheeling Park High School.

Despite the general decline of industry in the Rust Belt, several manufacturing facilities continued operating in Warwood into and beyond the late 20th century. Centre Foundry (1923-2023), Warwood Tool (1907-present), Wheeling Stamping Company (1957-early 1990s), Warwood Armature (1927-present), and the Ackermann Plant (various companies, 1930-present) continued to provide employment for Warwood residents. In 1967, three sets of rowhouses were constructed along North 18th and North 19th Streets just across the street from Warwood Tool Company (Map Nos. 313-323, 378, 376, 375, 373 and 381). These buildings represent the continuing evolution of workers' housing in their provision of more affordable and even denser development in close proximity to industrial workplaces. Residences constructed in Warwood after this consist of scattered infill in common late twentieth-century forms such as Split-level and Ranch.

The National Register boundary of the district begins at the southwest corner of Tax Parcel 10-W16-4 and follows the Ohio River north to the southwest corner of Tax Parcel 10-W7-2.1, then follows the north right-of-way limit of N. 20th Street to the southeast corner of Tax Parcel 10-W7-162, then follows the east edge of this parcel to the southeast corner of Tax Parcel 10-W5-40.11, then follows the east edge of this parcel to a point due east of the southwest corner of Tax Parcel 10-W5-86.3, then follows the rear parcel lines of all lots fronting N. 23rd Street to the west right-of-way limit of Warwood Avenue, then follows this right-of-way to the southeast corner of Tax Parcel 10-W8-58, then cross Warwood Avenue to the northwest corner of Tax Parcel 10-W8-274, then follows the northern edge of this parcel to the northeast corner, then follows the rear parcel lines of all properties fronting Warwood Avenue to the southeast corner of Tax Parcel 10-W13-88, then crosses Warwood Avenue to a point on the eastern edge of Tax Parcel 10-W13-2, then proceeds southwest along the western right-of-way limit of Warwood Avenue to southeast corner of Tax Parcel 10-W16-4, then proceeds northwest along this parcel boundary to the point of beginning.

Boundary Justification (Explain why the boundaries were selected.)

The boundaries for the Warwood Historic District include the central and southern portions of Warwood. These two areas comprise of two of the three original platted communities that make up Warwood. These boundaries include all industrial, commercial, and residential lots from Warwood Avenue to the Ohio River and from the Centre Foundry property to N. 23rd Street. A small number of parcels on Golden Drive north of N. 23rd Street and an area of commercial development east of Warwood Avenue in the northern part of the district are outside of the period of significance and are thus excluded.

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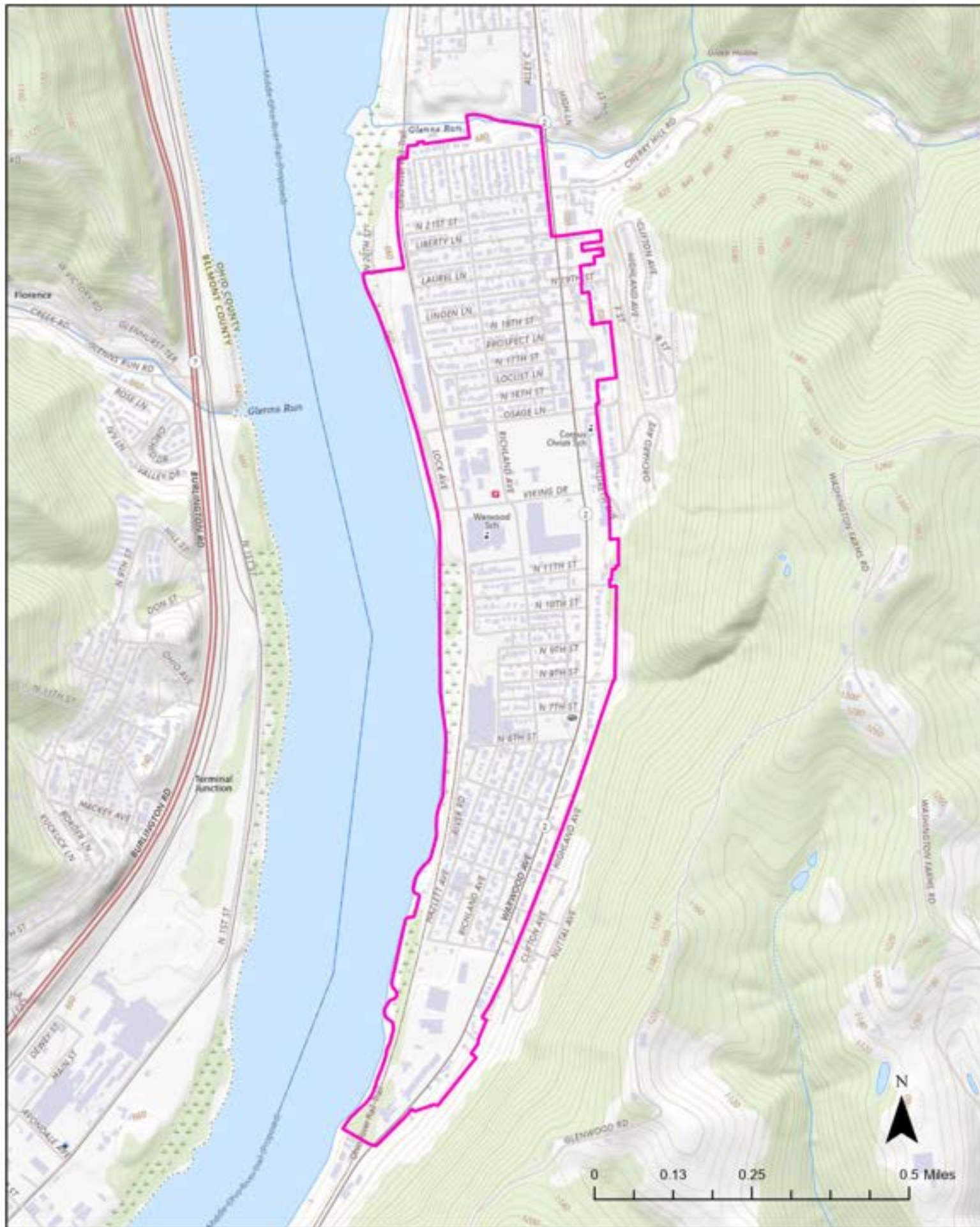

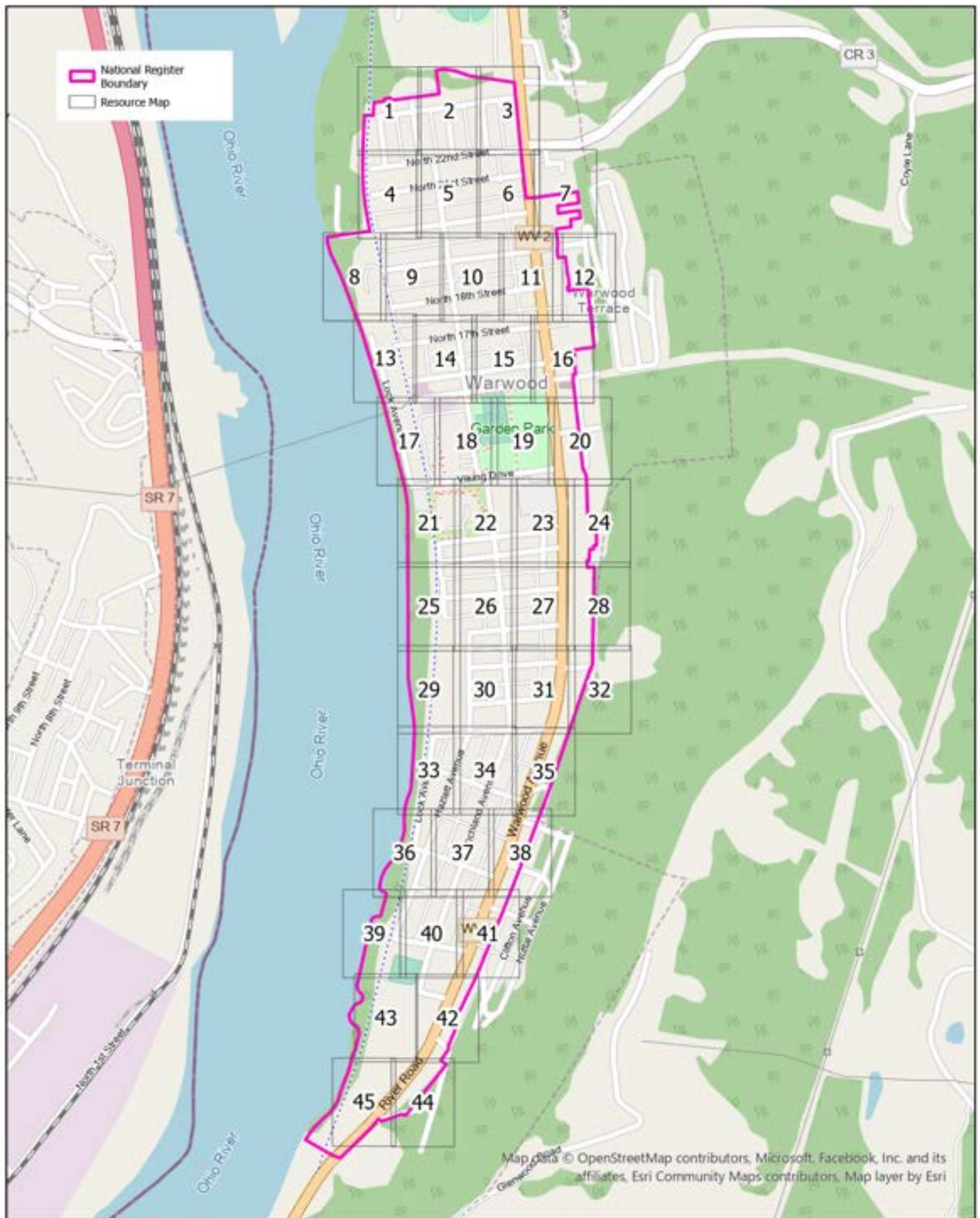


USGS Topo Map, Wheeling Quadrangle

 National Register Boundary



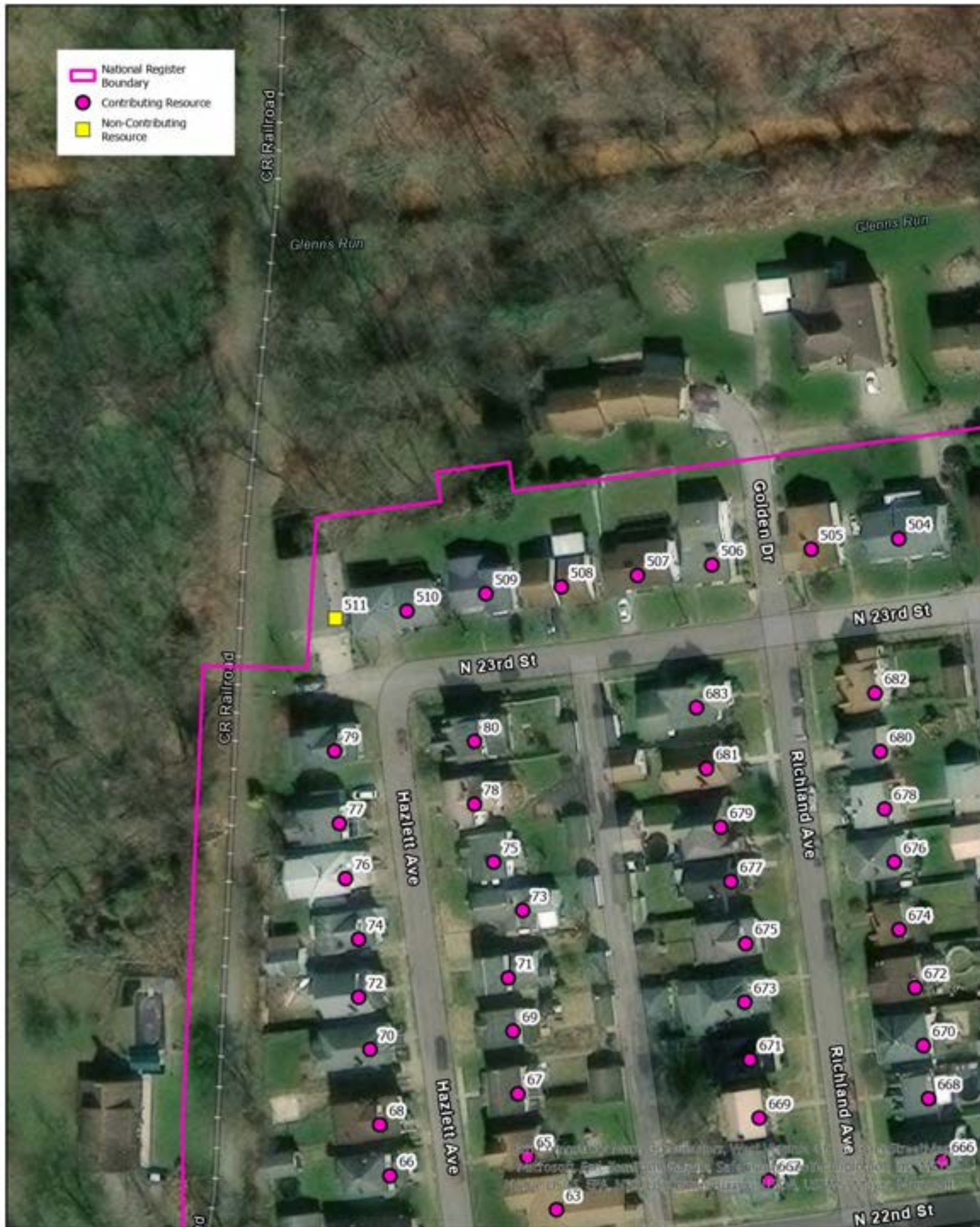
