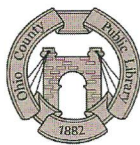

Researching Wheeling West Virginia Newspapers online

Searching for an obituary and unable to find the obituary

here are some tips...

Put your research in quotes "surname"

Example "Gilmore"

Dates 01/01/1930 01/31/1930 Enter

When researching you can narrow search down to monthly

However if you cannot locate your obit then sit and think what time period are you in.

1700's & 1800's type in the words: grains, wheat, rye, died, death, funeral or anything you can think of from that time period. This may get you to the date you are looking for.

In the early 1900's obits were kept in the classified section of the newspapers. This is where the Funeral Home advertised. Remember your Furniture stores and Funeral Homes were together because the Furniture Store owners were the ones who made the coffins. Also obituaries were not in a certain section of the newspapers like they are today. They were listed throughout the newspapers.

You can also use the words death, died, obituary, and funeral in the 1900's.

Even today you can use other words like funeral, obituary, & death.

Here's A Key to the City

James R. Paisley, he of the red tie insurance man, stamp collector, river buff, et al., told me the other day that even he was in the dark about the street names of the early 1800s.

"I have been reading 'The News That Was' and have constructed a sort of an index of street names but he suggested we jump ahead far enough to give the reader some orientation.

"At the Wheeling Room of the Ohio County Public Library we found in the City Directory of 1874-75 the new and the old street lineup—plus the locations of the major buildings of that period.

So, here's the orientation for the rest of the "The News That Was" to come prior to 1874. And we quote:

STREET DIRECTORY

The following street directory is not as systematically arranged as we would prefer to have, but will be found to be comprehensive and correct.

We give the name of the new street, with the old name appended. It will be seen that the streets are laid out east and west, north and south. The street numerically designated begins with First, at the head of Main street, in the north end of the city, and continuing in their regular order to the south end. There are no other name

given to any of the streets laid out east and west—if, for example, you wish to go to 'Twentieth from Tenth, you will know that you will have to go south ten squares; or if you wish to find 'Fifth, you will have to go five squares east. (sic?)

In numbering the houses each lot receives three numbers; and on the streets running north and south, each square will have one hundred numbers (sic?)

By this method any one can tell at a glance between what cross streets a certain number can be found. On the cross streets the numbers do not run one hundred to the square as on the streets running north and south.

The numbers commence at one at the river and run continuously to the end of the street—each lot having three numbers.

The following are the streets running east and west. The names in brackets are the old names.

First, (List) east from the river.

Fortieth, (Locust) east from the river.
Forty-first, (Oak) east from the river.
Forty-second, (Elm) east from the river.
Forty-third, (Willow) east from the river.
Forty-fourth, (Sycamore) east from the river.
Forty-fifth, (Beach) east from the river.
Forty-sixth, (Elm-Lagrange) east from the river.
Forty-seventh, (Poplar) east from the river.
Forty-eighth, (Depot) east from the river.



Tenth, (Madison) east from the suspension bridge.
Eleventh, (Union) and Spruce) east from the river.
Twelfth, (Monroe and Walnut) east from the river.
Thirteenth, (Hampden and Chestnut) east from the river.
Fourteenth, (Quincy) east from the river.
Fifteenth, (Center) east from the river.
Sixteenth, (John) east from the river.
Seventeenth, (Zane) east from the river.
Eighteenth, (Clay) east from the river.
Nineteenth, (Lindsley) east from the river.
Twentieth, (Webster) east from the river.
Twenty-first, from the river east to Market (Middle).
Twenty-second, (Third) east from the river.
Twenty-third, (Second) east from the river.

Twenty-fifth, (Marshall) east from the river.
Twenty-sixth, (Division) east from the river.
Twenty-seventh, (Preston) east from the river.

Dyron, from 12th, east end, south to Fourteenth.
Chapline, third street east from Water, from 10th south to the river, (formerly Fourth, Jacob and Third.)
Charles, from 11th south east to Jacob, sixth street east from Water.
Coal, from Caldwell north to the creek.
Eoff, fourth street west from Water, from 10th south to the river, (formerly Eoff, Bolton and Third.)
Elizabeth, from the creek, east end of 11th, to the creek.
Ellet, from 11th—east end—south to the creek.
High, from 11th south to 12th, seven streets east from Water.
Jacob, from 12th—five streets east from Water—south to the river, (formerly Sixth, German and Fifth.)
Lind, from 13th north to Fulton, around the hill.
Main, first street east from Water, from north end of the city south to the river, near 33rd.
Market, third street east to the river at 36th, (formerly Market, Fillmore and Second.)
McClure, from National road south to city limits, (formerly Fulton, Eighth, High, Coal and Seventh.)
South, from 14th south and east to Market, first street east from the river.

Warren, the main street south of the creek (Manchester).
Water, first street along the river.

STREETS RUNNING NORTH AND SOUTH
Baltimore, from east end of 12th north to 11th.

12th south to city limits, (formerly Seventh, Lee, George and Sixth.)

ALLEYS

East of the river the alleys laid out north and south are lettered A, B, C, D, E, &c., beginning at the first alley east of Water. The alleys running east and west are designated numerically 1, 2, 3, 4, &c.

Streets running east and west. The names of the streets in brackets are the old names.
Goodrich, first street south from Zane, from Front west.
Indiana, second street south from Zane, (Third) from Front west.
Kentucky, third street north from Zane, (Fourth) from Front west.
Maryland, first street north of Zane, (Second) from Front west.
New Jersey, fourth street north from Zane, (Fifth) from Front west.
Ohio, third street south from Zane, from south Front west.
Virginia, second street south from Zane, from south Front west.
Zane, from suspension bridge west to Bridgeport bridge.

STREETS RUNNING NORTH AND SOUTH
Broadway, third street east from Front, (Broadway and Locust) north from Zane to Front and south to limits.
Front, first street from river, (Elm) north and south from Zane to limits.
Pine, second street west from river, (Penn and Pine) north and south from Zane.
Wabash, sixth street west from Front, (Wabash and Cedar) north and south from Zane.
York, fourth street west from Front, (York and Chestnut) north and south from Zane.

After reading the list over, it sounds to us as though changes were made since 1874 and perhaps the list was compiled by someone not thoroughly familiar with Wheeling. The list is reproduced as it appeared in the 1874-75 directory.

To the Researcher

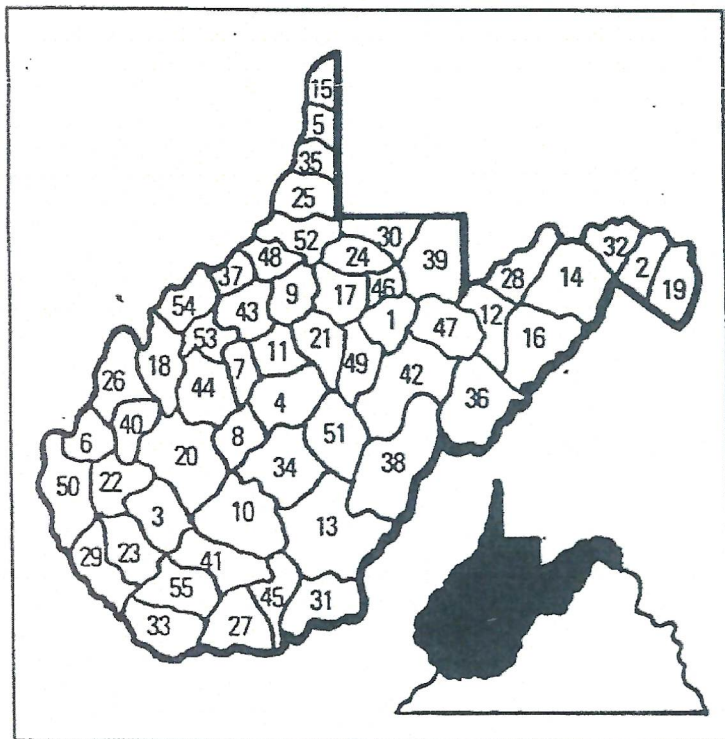
Genealogical research in West Virginia should be approached with as much specific information as possible.

A knowledge of geographic locations is essential as most materials are arranged by county.

Staff members are available to assist with reference sources, research procedures and the use of records.

Counties in West Virginia

Until 1863, the area now known as West Virginia was part of the Commonwealth of Virginia. The Library collections include some Virginia materials, but most pertain to what is now West Virginia. The Library is the premier resource for West Virginians and those with possible "roots" in the state.

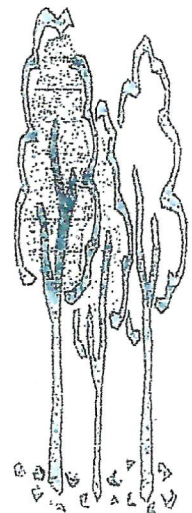
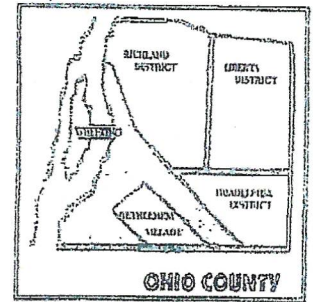
